We will examine a selection of rocks and minerals which have been prepared for making jewelry.

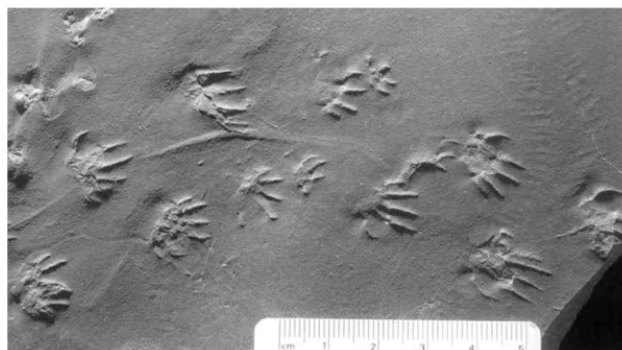
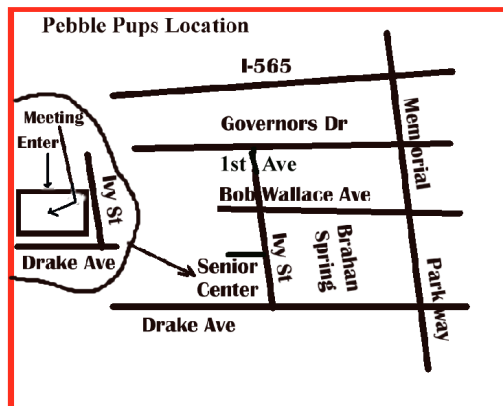
There will be an open discussion about what we do with the rocks we find.



Report on the Steven Minkin Tracksite near Jasper AL September 9th

The Steven C. Minkin Paleozoic Footprint Site in [Walker County](#) is the most prolific source of vertebrate trackways of its age in the world. The fossil trackways are preserved in shale that formed from mud on a tropical freshwater tidal flat about 315 million years ago. We had a good turnout, both of the Pebble Pup families and other members of the HGMS. There were several other families from all over the area. Prescott Atkinson of the Alabama Paleontology Society was our gracious host. It didn't take long to learn which types of rocks to split to find fossils. Only a few tracks were found, but there were ferns, calamites stems, and lycopod bark in fair abundance. Mr. Brian found a slab with over thirty tiny tracks from two different lizards sprinkled across the surface. JUST A DROP

Hobby shops and model airplane stores carry small plastic dispenser bottles that are handy for putting a drop of flux, oil, or glue just where you want it. They have a length of small metal tubing coming out the top that lets you squeeze out very small drops.

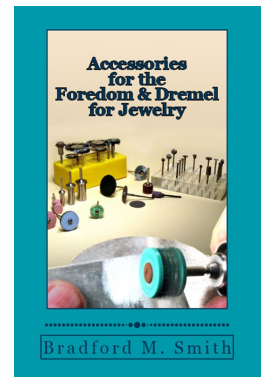
I use one with a short length of tubing for oil when I'm sawing or when drilling harder metals like steel. Another bottle I found in a plastics store has a longer length of metal tubing on it. Plastics people use them for dispensing fast drying glues to join pieces of acrylic. The long metal tube lets you reach into tight places. Either of these is handy for flux at the soldering station.

Patty Quarry, Summerville, GA **No Fees**
Sunday, October 1, 2017 10:00 AM Eastern (9 am Central)

Due to storm damage from hurricane Irma, the trip originally scheduled for Saturday, September 30 had to be cancelled and replaced with this trip on Sunday, October 1

COLLECTING: Lace agate/chert, silicified oolitic chert, some jaspers.

BRING: Rock hammer, scratching tools, buckets, and paper for wrapping specimens. You will also need gloves, protective eyewear, hat, sunscreen, and sturdy boots with ankle support.

FACILITIES: There are no facilities at the quarry, but the site is not far from town. The Knoxville Gem & Mineral Society members will have free water and snacks available for everyone

CHILDREN: This field trip is suitable for children but they must be supervised at all times.

PETS: No pets are allowed

SAFETY: This is an active quarry. **STAY AWAY** from all heavy equipment, quarry machinery and any areas declared off limits. Any violation of this requirement could jeopardize future access to this site.

WAIVER: All participants must sign a waiver before entering the collecting site

From Chattanooga

- 1) Take I-75 south from Chattanooga, TN South towards Atlanta, GA to Ringgold, GA
- 3) Take the first Ringgold, GA exit (exit 348) and turn right on GA-151 and go 25 miles to US-27
- 4) Turn left onto US-27 and go 5 miles to Summerville, GA
- 5) The road will split in Summerville, GA, stay left on US-27 South, you will cross a concrete bridge on the south side of Summerville. The meeting place is on the right about 1.5 miles after crossing the bridge. Look for a building on the right with large piles of rock in front of it

From Huntsville- 95 Miles

Take US 72 to Scottsboro. Turn right on AL 35 and cross the Tennessee River.

Immediately across the bridge turn left on AL 40 toward Hene-gar, Hammondville, and Valley Head.

Follow AL117 through Valley Head to Mentone on top of Look-out Mountain. Hwy117 becomes

GA Hwy 48 at the state line. Continue through Menlo GA and on to Summerville on GA 48. In downtown Summerville, turn right on GA 27. Go 2.4 miles and look for the buildings on the right with the rock piles in front.

Saturday, October 28, 2017, 10:00 AM - 2:30 PM Eastern
Polk County, GA

TRIP: This is a favorite collecting trip of CCGMS. New areas are bulldozed each time and jasper is plentiful and easy to find.

COLLECTING: We will collect beautiful jasper pieces that make excellent cabochons. The pieces are multi-colored in reds, yellows, whites, and blacks with both banding and mottled arrangements.

BRING: Rock hammer, small pick or shovel for light digging, a garden rake, work gloves and a bucket to put finds in. Please fill any holes you make as this is a working cattle ranch and we are grateful to the owner for letting us collect on his land. New areas have been bulldozed so that the jasper is quite easy to find. You might want to bring a spray bottle of water to clean finds. Bring your lunch and water to drink. The hosting club will have bottled water and snacks available.

CHILDREN: Yes, this is a great trip for children of all ages with parental supervision.

PETS: No. This is a working cattle ranch, no dogs are allowed.

FACILITIES: There are no facilities at the site.

DIRECTIONS AND WHERE TO MEET:

We will meet at 10:00am EST at the Ingles Market parking lot (1100 Nathan Dean Bypass, Rockmart, GA 30153) next to McDonald's on US Highway 278 (GA-6 Bypass) on the north side of Rockmart, GA. This location is set back about 50 feet along the south-side of the divided highway called the "Nathan Dean Bypass." This is not shown on Google Maps or Google Earth or Streetview.

DIRECTIONS for Out-of-State Travelers: If you drive into Georgia going south on I-75, then you should take GA-113 West at Cartersville (exit #28). Follow Main Street/West Street through Cartersville and 20 more miles on GA-113 to Rockmart, GA. At the stoplight turn right (East) on US 278 (Nathan Dean Parkway) and go ¼ mile to view the Ingles Parking lot on your left (south side of road) next to McDonalds. If you are coming into Georgia going East on I-20 take exit 11 north on US-27 (Bremen By-Pass) for 25 miles to the Cedartown By-Pass (US 278), where you will exit by-pass following US-278 East for 12 miles to Rockmart, GA. The Ingles Parking lot is on your right, just past McDonalds as you enter Rockmart. This is 140 miles from Huntsville by way of Fort Payne and south from Rome GA on GA Hwy 101.
