
### **Rocket City Jewelers (RCJ) News**

Hello jewelry makers! RCJ is open to all HGMS members 16 and older. All skill levels are welcome! We've started taking signups for 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter classes. Please arrive early so we can start on time. Note: RCJ will have a display case at the October  $13 - 15^{th}$  show. All RCJ members are invited to contribute to the display. Please bring your contributions to RCJ meetings beginning September 20th.

#### 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter Classes:



Oct 4: 2-5p and 6-9p. Cold Forge Wire Wrap Marathon. Tools will be provided.

Oct 18: 6 – 9p/Oct 25: 2 – 5p: LoveKnot (Forever) Chainmaille Bracelet. Make a bracelet in the LoveKnot weave using bronze jump rings. Bring 2 pairs of flat nose pliers. You can add a heart charm to your bracelet. Tools for personalizing your heart will be provided.

Nov 1: 6 - 9p/Nov 8: 2 - 5p: Twisted Metal Earrings. Make various styles of earrings in copper and nickel. Bring your own beads, if desired. Tools will be provided.

Nov 15: 6 - 9p/Nov 29: 2 - 5p: Enchantress Earrings. Make a pair of earrings in the Enchantress weave. Bring your own beads, if desired. Bring flat nose pliers (2 pairs), round nose pliers, and cutters.

Dec 6: 2-5p and 6-9p. Make Up Marathon. You must sign up in advance.

You will design a panel bracelet in October and fabricate your design in November. We'll be using the acetylene torch. Some of the pieces will be small and fiddley, but very doable with some patience.

October Class. - 2nd and 5th



We'll provide a worksheet and templates to get you started. The example in the photo has been purposely left blank, unadorned. This is your starting point. You'll need your imagination to come up with design elements for the panels. Things to consider along the way are design viability, wearability, cohesion of the elements, materials and cost. Questions will be answered and advice given during our regular open studio hours.

Paperwork for this class may be picked up on October 2nd or 5th, cost is \$1.00, which covers printing. Please finalize your design by the 23rd so I can order necessary materials.

November Class. - 2nd and 6th


This month you'll fabricate your design! We'll also learn a new type of connection and a new style of clasp. Cost will depend on the materials used in your bracelet.

This month, we will have a new meeting format. We will have stations set up so each Pup can turn in home work, work an activity that you missed, explore something new and of course, participate in the current program.

And this month's program is laying out the Pups display cabinet for the show. So be sure to bring your favorite rock/mineral that you want to display in our cabinet. And make sure you bring a label telling what it is, where your found it (if you personally collected it) and your name and age. First name and last name initial if OK. We just want to make sure you get your rock back.



#### Mineral of the Month – Borax

Borax is a salt (a chemical compound with no electric charge, for example, table salt), a borate of sodium with the chemical formula  $Na_2H_20B_4O_{17}$ . It's a colorless (white) crystalline mineral that dissolves in water, creating a basic (as opposed to acidic) solution. This mineral occurs naturally in deposits in dry lake beds created by the repeated evaporation of seasonal desert lakes.



The name borax was derived from the Middle English word *boras*. Borax mined in Asian countries is known as *tincal* (from Malay, the official language of Indonesia) and *tincar* (from Urdu/Persian Arabic). These two words were adopted into the English language in the 17<sup>th</sup> century.



Borax was first discovered in dry lake beds in Tibet. In the 8<sup>th</sup> century, tincal from Tibet, Persia, and other parts of Asia was traded by way of the Silk Road to the Arabian Peninsula. In the late 19<sup>th</sup> century, American miner Francis Smith formed the Pacific Coast Borax Company and began hauling borax out of California and Nevada deserts using wagons hitched to 20-mule teams. In 1893, this method was replaced by a rail spur, the 20 Mule Team Borax trademark was created, and the company started marketing and popularizing borax in a variety of applications. Today, the 20-Mule Team product lines are owned and manufactured by the American consumer products division of the Henkel company.

In the United States, the most commercially important deposits of borax are found in Boron, California; Searles Lake, California; and many other locations in the Southwest. Worldwide, borax is mined in Turkey, Chile, Bolivia, Tibet, and Romania. Borax is commonly available in powder form and has many industrial and household uses. In addition to laundry booster, borax is used in Boraxo powdered hand soap and tooth bleaching products. Other uses include pesticide; soldering flux; pottery glaze component; artisanal gold mining; and fire retardant, to name a few. In chemical laboratories, borax is used as a pharmaceutic alkalizer, and to determine HbA1c (a form of hemoglobin chemically linked to sugar), which is an indicator of long-term high blood sugar in diabetes patients.



This month's mineral was inspired by National Soap Making Day, September 30<sup>th</sup>. Rockhounds are no strangers to getting dirty.
