

One station will be making a tree ornament from a quartz crystal. We will be learning wire wrapping techniques! And you will keep yours for your tree.









Mineral of the Month – Thorite: var. Orangite

In the culinary world this time of year, millions of pumpkins find their way into Fall recipes and into our stomachs! In the mineral world, perhaps we can satisfy our yen for pumpkin, visually at least, with orangite! This beautiful orange mineral, with a little imagination, resembles raw pumpkin.



Orangite is a variety of the mineral thorite, a rare radioactive silicate mineral of the metallic element thorium. Thorite's formula is (Th,U)SiO₄. This mineral was originally discovered in 1828 by Norwegian mineralogist Hans Esmark. He found the original black specimens in a pegmatite (an igneous rock consisting of interlocking crystals often reaching extreme size and perfection) in Norway. In 1829, Swedish chemist Jacob Berzelius named the mineral *thorite* because he found the new element thorium in it (thorium was previously unknown). Berzelius is considered to be one of the founders of modern chemistry (along with Robert Boyle, John Dalton, and Antoine Lavoisier). Most pegmatites consist of *felsic* igneous rocks that are relatively rich in light elements, such as silicon, oxygen, aluminum, sodium and potassium; the building blocks of quartz, feldspar and mica._(The word *pegmatite* comes from the Homeric Greek word *pegnymi*, which means "to bind together". Homeric Greek is the Greek language that Homer used in the *Iliad* and the *Odyssey*.)



But the pegmatite in which Esmark originally found thorite was a *syenite* pegmatite. Syenite pegmatites are rare. They contain very little, if any, quartz and feldspar. They tend to be rich in dark elements, such as magnesium and iron, that form olivine, pyroxene, amphibole and biotite. Today, thorite is also found in volcanic rocks, hydrothermal veins, and metamorphic rocks. Its crystal system is tetragonal, and its hardness is 4.5 on the Mohs scale, which means it's between fluorite and apatite in hardness. Short prismatic crystals with pyramid shaped ends have been

found. But because it's radioactive, thorite commonly degrades in such a way that it destroys its own internal crystal structure leaving it amorphous like glass, so crystals are rare.



Thorite can be black (like the type specimens Esmark found), brownish black, orange (orangite), yellowish-orange and dark green. A variety of thorite called uranothorite is currently an important ore of uranium. Orangite was discovered in a syenite pegmatite in Brevig, Norway in 1851 (not the same pegmatite where Esmark originally found thorite). It was first described by the famous mineral dealer Bergeman and Krantz. Minerals commonly associated with orangite are natrolite, pectolite, zircon, allanite and diopside. Today, orangite is found in Alaska, California, Massachusetts and New Jersey, and in many international localities, but the source of that amazing orange color is still Brevig. Both thorite

and orangite are occasionally faceted into gemstones, but I couldn't find any health information related to wearing them. However, I did find the IGS (International Gem Society) toxicity table at https://www.gemsociety.org/article/gemstone-toxicity-table/, although thorite isn't listed. That may mean that the level of radiation in thorite gemstones is negligible. So do your research before you buy! References: wikipedia.org, mindat.org

HGMS Board & Committee Meeting Minutes – 26 Sep 2023, 8:30pm, following the General Membership Meeting. A Quorum of the Board members was present for any official business to be conducted. Thirteen members were present The meeting was called for the purpose of clarifying various questions concerning the upcoming Fall Show.

Shelley asked: Who would get the items for the Raffle Bags, provide the Raffle tickets, and who would oversee them at the Show? There was no clear answer but Tony is probably responsible and would use left-over door prizes from last year. Hopefully Rodney Lane will be present to monitor the Raffle and the Guess-the-#-of Rocks Jar. Bill will contact Rodney. Gene will supply the jar and the rocks, pre-counted.

Red vests have been ordered – 50 in three sizes – 3XL (3), 2XL (27), M (20). They will be delivered by Oct 4.to Bill's house. Jan ordered 200 sticker logos to be applied for the show to any vests that are not purchased by members. Fifty cloth patches were ordered by Anthony and are on-hand for any to purchase for their own vests or aprons. Patches cost \$6 and vests cost \$10. There will be a box for the generally available vests in the Information Booth, which members may check out at the start of their work shift and return when they complete their shift. Used ones will be cleaned after the Show for next year and they will be stored in the Winchester storage unit.

Will there be a Vendor Refreshment cart, who will stock it, and who will convey it during the show? Tony has cups, ice is available from the Jaycees kitchen, and drinks will be ones left over from the Thursday evening Vendor Appreciation Meal, which is being handled by Deborah Barnhart.

For clarification, Jan is Assistant Vendor Chairman, working with Lowell toward his retirement.

Signs for many areas are needed. Jan is preparing them. Demonstrations (managed by Shelley & Kathy); Kids Area (sign is on hand, to be managed by Mike Harrison), ATM machine (which will be provided by Lynn Wood and which will be in the Information Booth); Information Booth (managed by Theresa), Restrooms, Food (which will be provided by a contracted Vendor – name not recorded here); Fossil Dig (which will be managed by James Yack); Front Outside Wall (on hand in storage, may need a bigger one); Flume (sign is in storage unit); Fluorescent Room (sign is in storage unit). The signs will be in large letters and mounted high above each area.

Flume bags were loaded by a work crew on Sat 16 Oct. They are currently stored in the Lapidary Room/

A motion was made and approved to create a third scholarship in 2024 for \$300 to be restricted for availability to those in leadership roles for HGMS activities – RCJ, Metals, Lapidary, Pups, etc, to reward one of these particular volunteers for their service. These leaders may also apply for the generally available scholarships, but can only win one. Prior winners are not eligible for the general drawing per the ByLaws.
